What is a commitment card?

A commitment card helps the church understand what kinds of gifts to expect and when to expect them. By completing this card, you allow the church to move forward with a thoughtful, wise financial plan.

What if my circumstances change after I have made a pledge?

A commitment card is a statement of intent, not a contract. If your financial circumstances change significantly, your giving may also change. Simply contact the church to adjust your commitment – letting the church know about the change (increase, decrease, or timing) in your giving.

Is my commitment confidential?

Yes, only our financial services staff has knowledge of pledges and giving records.

When do I begin giving?

How long will this campaign last?

We are asking for a three year financial response that formally begins in May. You decide your personal giving schedule – weekly, monthly, quarterly, one time gifts or asset transfers, or another schedule of your choice. Decide on a plan that works best for you; then, help the church understand your giving plan.
