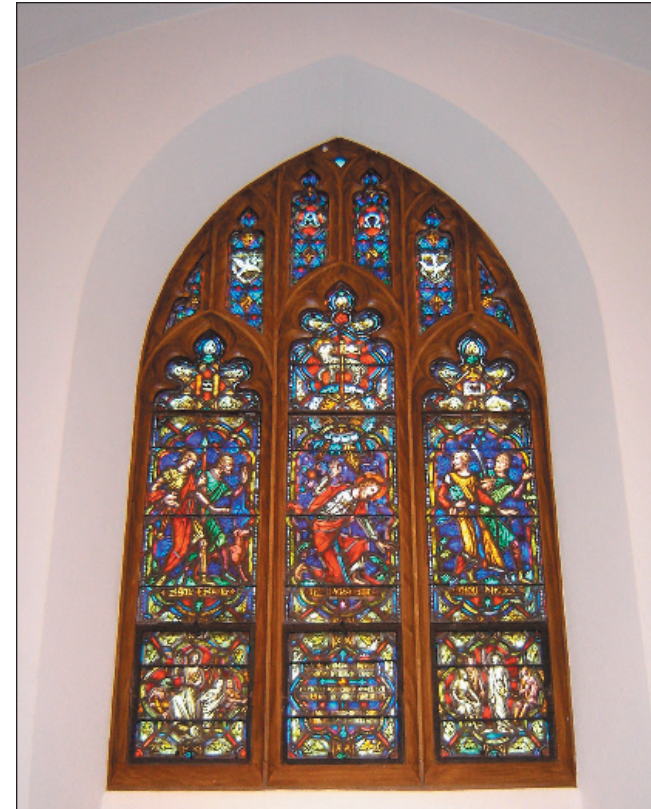

Education For Ministry (EFM)

EFM, is a program of theological education-at-a-distance of the School of Theology of the University of the South. Students sign up one year at a time for this four-year program. It covers the basics of a theological education in the Old and New Testaments, church history, liturgy, and theology. Students meet Tuesday night at 7:00 PM in the Library, (next to the Parish Hall), under the guidance of Alan Lindsay.

Eucharist Ministers

It is a honor and privilege to serve at the altar. Eucharist Ministers are licensed by the Diocese of Pennsylvania to assist the clergy in administering the Communion and leading the Psalm and Prayers of the People. There is one Eucharist Minister at the 8 AM service, and two at the 10:00 AM service.

Lectors

St. Paul's is fortunate to have a committed group of people to read the lessons each Sunday at both services and special services throughout the Church Year. Two people are assigned to read at the 10:00 AM worship service and one person is assigned to read at the 8:00 AM worship service. A schedule is prepared and distributed monthly, listing both the readings and the people assigned to them.

Prayer Chain

An intercessory Prayer Chain is a group of people who have been called to the ministry of praying for others on an ongoing basis. The true purpose of praying for others is to offer ourselves as channels of God's grace. St. Paul's prayer chain is comprised of a dozen members, who are faithful to this ministry and anyone can initiate a prayer request. New requests, as well as updates, are communicated to the group by a leader. When we act as intercessor we are offering our hearts as channels through which the healing love of God may be directed to those for whom we are praying.

Sacraments

We celebrate the Holy Eucharist at both the 8:00 and 10:00 AM services every Sunday. The sacraments of baptism, marriage and burial can be scheduled by calling the office.

Acolytes

All children and young adults, grades four (4) through twelve (12) are encouraged to participate in this program, which provides spiritual growth and a sense of belonging to the Church community. Adult members of our Parish family are welcome to join this ministry, as well. Training sessions are held in the early fall, and are supported by on-the-job training throughout the Church year.

Our adult acolytes serve at the 8:00 a.m. Sunday Worship Service. Our junior acolytes serve at the 10:00 a.m. Worship Service.

Altar Guild

St. Paul's continues to be very fortunate to have a group of dedicated women serving on Altar Guild. The time commitment is generally only an hour on Saturday and fifteen to twenty minutes on Sunday. Working in pairs on Saturday mornings, they prepare the Church and arrange the altar flowers for Sunday worship services. They also prepare the Church for weddings, funerals, baptisms and other special services and celebrations. New members are needed and are always welcome.

Bread Bakers

When we receive the bread and the wine during the Eucharist, we are touching and being touched by God. Something we all know – and sometimes need to remind ourselves – is how very sacred and powerful is the action of sharing the Body and Blood of our Lord and Savior. It is also sacred and powerful when a Bread Baker prepares bread that is then blessed, broken and distributed to be for us the spiritual food of Christ. You do not have to already be a "Bread Baker," as we will share recipes and techniques when we get together.

Breakfast Teams

French toast made from an old southern recipe; a casserole made of sausage, eggs, cheese, and mild chili peppers served with salsa; creamed chip beef served over muffins; bagels with cream cheese and fresh fruit – all possibilities that might await you if you join us for breakfast at St. Paul's. In addition to the obvious benefits of having breakfast served to you without your having to prepare, clean up or wash dishes, you might have time to sit down over a cup of coffee and catch up with someone you haven't seen in a while. You do not have to be a chef to serve on a team (on-going training is part of the plan) and the time commitment is for a short time, just once every six weeks.

Choir

Music is such a fundamental part of our Christian heritage. It is often said that by singing to God, you pray twice. The St. Paul's Choir helps lead our congregation in joyful music to God and serves at our Sunday morning 10:00 service and most of our special services throughout the year. Our organist and Choir Director is Kedron Miller. Choir rehearsals are held at 7:30 PM Thursday night, and 9:30 AM on Sundays.

Communications

This group keeps the parish informed about what our church has to offer and how everyone can contribute to its life and ministries.

We spread the news with the Messenger, (Saint Paul's newsletter), Sunday Bulletins, Church web site, advertisements for upcoming events, and, of course The Church Mouse!

Community Garden

The Nancy Hollywood Community Garden at St. Paul's currently has 14 double-raised beds—2 that support the Food Bank, 2 for St. Paul's use, and 10 for rent to the community that can be used for personal use or to grow food for the Food Bank. There are many ways our community youth can get involved. Volunteering at the garden is a wonderful way to meet senior project requirements, scout badges, or learning about organic sustainable gardening practices.

Education

Sunday School is held Sunday mornings during the worship service. The children attend Church with their parents and will be dismissed to their classrooms with their teachers after the opening prayer. They return to receive communion.

We offer classes for: Ages 2-3 Pre-k/K Grades 1-2 Grades 3-4 Grades 5-6 Our Sunday School program uses music, songs, stories, games and crafts to teach about the Bible, Jesus Christ, and the Episcopal Church. The Sunday School curriculum helps the children to Know the Word of God, Grow in Faith, and Show Service in Christ's name. We have wonderful and dedicated teachers and we use a Team Teacher approach where each teacher is responsible for teaching a class on an alternating week schedule.

Junior Youth Group

The St. Paul's Youth Group assists youth in growing in their faith by engaging them in questions of faith and life through a series of media and group discussions; youth-developed worship; outreach; and fellowship. The Junior Youth Group meets every other Sunday right after church for lunch from 12:30 to 2:30.

Adult Education

The men of St. Paul's and their friends meet twice a month for Bible Study preceded by a great breakfast. The group meets on the 2nd and 4th Saturdays of each month. The 2nd Saturday meeting is held at St. Paul's Church in the Lockwood Reilly building (next to the Parish Hall). The 4th Saturday meeting is at The Stadium Grill in Eagle. Breakfast is served at 7:30 and the Bible Study starts at 8:00 AM ending promptly at 9:00 AM. All are welcome.

Dialogue with Scriptures

A women's Bible Study meets every Saturday from 9:30 to 11:00. Finding new insights, new challenges in the beloved stories found in our Bible. We enjoy fellowship, with coffee and treats, as well as prayer to begin and close our meetings and time for each person to bring concerns for others into our awareness. This in addition to dedicated investigation of Scripture, and lively discussions!
