The 2009 Annual Report was distributed to all present.

Pastor Maxine opened the meeting with a prayer at 9:15am.

Pastor Maxine has been at St Paul's for a little over a year and a half and it has been a very successful year.

We now have an Acolyte corps of 22 and a group of 20 Lectors. We also have a group of Ushers.
